American Cancer Society®: Road to Recovery

With volunteers all over the country, the American Cancer Society (ACS) helps people living with cancer get rides to their appointments. Here's what you can expect:

- Each volunteer has a good driving record, a valid driver's license and auto insurance
- Each volunteer must complete an ACS training course
- The ACS will try to connect you to a volunteer in your area
 - If there are no volunteers in your area, the ACS may help you find a local organization that offers similar support

CancerCare®: Transportation assistance

Cancer*Care* is a nonprofit organization that helps people with cancer, including with transportation assistance to doctors' appointments.

To be eligible for transportation assistance, you'll need to:

- Provide confirmation of your cancer diagnosis
- Be actively treating your cancer
- Live in the United States or Puerto Rico
- Meet eligibility guidelines of 250% of the Federal Poverty Limit

To find out if you're eligible, call 1-800-813-HOPE (4673) and complete a short interview with a social worker. Cancer Care is available from 9 $_{AM}$ to 7 $_{PM}$ ET, Monday

through Thursday, and from 9 $_{\mbox{AM}}$ to 5 $_{\mbox{PM}}$ ET on Friday.
